ito nṛsiḿhaḥ parato nṛsiḿho yato yato yāmi tato nṛsiḿhaḥ bahir nṛsiḿho hṛdaye nṛsiḿho nṛsiḿham ādiḿ śaraṇaḿ prapadye	Lord Nṛsimhadeva is here, and He is also there on the opposite side. Wherever I go, there I see Lord Nṛsimhadeva. He is outside and within my heart. Therefore I take shelter of Lord Nṛsimhadeva, the original Supreme Personality of Godhead (CC Antya 16.53).

The Lord is always complete in knowledge within Himself. Let us offer obeisances unto Nṛsimhadeva (Śrīdhara Svāmī in his commentary on SB 10.87.1).
prahlāda-hṛdayāhlādam bhaktāvidyā-vidāraṇam śarad-indu-rucim vande pārīndra-vadanam harim	Let me offer my obeisances unto Lord Nṛsimhadeva, who is always enlightening Prahlāda Mahārāja within his heart and who always kills the nescience that attacks the devotees. His mercy is distributed like moonshine, and His face is like that of a lion. Let me offer my obeisances unto Him again and again (Śrīdhara Svāmī in his commentary on SB 1.1.1).
śrī-nṛsimha, jaya nṛsimha, jaya jaya nṛsimha prahlādeśa jaya padmā-mukha-padma-bhṛṅga	All glories to Nṛsimhadeva! All glories to Nṛsimhadeva, who is the Lord of Prahlāda Mahārāja and, like a honeybee, is always engaged in beholding the lotuslike face of the goddess of fortune. (CC Madhya 8.5)

ugro 'py anugra evāyaḿ sva-bhaktānāḿ nṛ-keśarī keśarīva sva-potānām anyeṣāḿ ugra-vikramaḥ	Although very ferocious, the lioness is very kind to her cubs. Similarly, although very ferocious to nondevotees like Hiraṇyakaśipu, Lord Nṛsimhadeva is very, very soft and kind to devotees like Prahlāda Mahārāja (CC Madhya 8.6)
tava kara-kamala-vare nakham adbhuta-śṛńgam dalita-hiraṇyakaśipu-tanu-bhṛńgam keśava dhṛta-narahari-rūpa jaya jagadīśa hare	O Keśava! O Lord of the universe! O Lord Hari, who have assumed the form of half-man, half-lion! All glories to You! Just as one can easily crush a wasp between one's fingernails, so in the same way the body of the wasp like demon Hiraṇyakaśipu has been ripped apart by the wonderful pointed nails on Your beautiful lotus hands.
